The secrets of success are hidden in the Bible, how much effort we put into finding them and how committed we are to applying them determines how far we go in life (Job 29:4; Deuteronomy 29:29).

Outstanding, enviable, visible, striking, unexplainable, but undeniable success is what the contents of the Bible promise (Joshua 1:3). Every seed of Abraham is made for success. Life is not about surviving, but about making impact (Mathew 5:13-15).

You are to give light to your environment; you are the light of the world. You are also the salt of the earth; salt is a global product with a global value. You need to expand your thinking; if you think local, you remain local. Think global and that is not to make a name, but to make impact. Redemption has made you a global phenomenon. Stop thinking survival; that is what makes you a slave, think impact! Redemption should get you to stand up to issues. It takes possibility mentality to be a man or woman of impact.

What Does it Take to Command Outstanding Success?

Knowing what to do to attain success is very vital. Sharpen your understanding of what to do (Ecclesiastes 10:10). It takes plenty of self discipline to be an outstanding success. Self discipline is operating as demanded, not as convenient, maximising the time. Discipline is making your choice and standing by it, circumstances notwithstanding. Benjamin Franklin once said, "Does thou love life? Invest your time; don't squander it, for that is the stuff which life is made of."

Nobody will ever be more distinguished than he is disciplined. Discipline is order (Ecclesiastes 10:18). The platform is discipline, but the delivery is at the cost of diligence. Success however, grows at the cost of sacrifice. The culture of sacrifice is so relevant for anyone not to lose value and relevance. It takes

discipline to keep driving even when people around you think you are a success.

Success is a highly costly commodity. Only those who taste it know its value. Just anybody can succeed if they know what it takes and give it all it takes. Pay the price of diligence for delivery and subscribe to the law of sacrifice for sustenance. Wrong work wears people out; right work defines and refines people.
