A Capital Price For Success

The capital price for success in any human endeavour is hard work. Any faith that seeks to make God absolutely responsible for the outcome of his/her life is an irresponsible faith.

To succeed, you must commit to the law of hard work. That's the only way to be listed among high flyers. It is the quality of labour we engage in today that creates the future of our dreams.
