Understanding: The Master Key to a World of Exploits

Understanding is what commands the world of exploits. The word of God is the wisdom of God and it's by the light of the word that we command exploits (Isaiah 60:2; Psalm 119:130; Proverbs 4:8; Isaiah 60:8).

The word of God is supernatural in origin, eternal in duration, regenerative in power and infinite in scope. If you are born again, you have an unlimited destiny in Christ (1 Corinthians 2:9; John 14:12).

We are in the dispensation of the Spirit of God (John 16:7-13). The Holy Spirit is here to help you and I access a deeper level of understanding in Christ.

Pathways to Spiritual understanding

- Be born again: You must be born again and filled with the Holy Ghost (John 3:3). If you are not born again, you are not qualified to receive the Holy Ghost. Your joy is not in the substance of the wealth or riches, but in your relationship with God.
- You must crave to know: There has to be a desperation to know (Isaiah 55:1-11).
- Engage the Holy Spirit in your quest for understanding: We must constantly engage the Holy Spirit by praying in the Holy Ghost. Only a born again and Spirit-filled man can pray in the Holy Ghost (1 Corinthians 2:12-13; Jude 20).

Proofs of Spiritual Insight

- Supernatural faith: Supernatural faith is produced when light comes (Acts 8:26-39).
- Confidence: Confidence is a function of spiritual understanding (Daniel 11:32). When you have access to light, your confidence is boosted.

How Do We Engage the Understanding of the Word of God for Exploits?

- Make a project of your desired goal: Programme your activities around your desired goal. Examples are Nehemiah, Esther, Daniel, etc.
- Embark on a desperate search in most cases with fasting and prayer to access the way out. Believe the Holy Spirit for understanding. Believe there must be a way out of the challenge (Mathew 7:7-8; Proverbs 18:1; Isaiah 58:8-10). When light comes, that is the end of darkness.
- Give yourself wholly to your findings without restrictions. The word of God will always work if you put it to work (1 Timothy 4:15).
