The contents of the Holy Bible constitutes the master key to a world of exploits (Hebrews 11 vs. 3), and words are vital channels for unleashing exploits. As a believer, if you know nothing else in the world, but the content of the Bible, then you are a candidate for strange exploits (Psalm 1 vs. 1 - 3).

WHAT IS EXPLOIT? Exploits are notable deeds, spirited or heroic acts, an act or deed that is brilliant. It is doing what eyes have not seen nor ears heard.

It is expected that the life of a believer must be one that moves from the realm of success to impact, and to exploits. However, wisdom is the bedrock for exploits (Proverbs 8 vs. 12 – 16; Matthew 13 vs. 54; Luke 11 vs. 49), and God's word is God's wisdom bank in print.

Doing what the bible says will turn any dummy into a wonder. Biblically speaking, there is no old or new fashion truth (Jeremiah 6 vs. 16 - 17). Truth is truth, and the wisdom of the Bible knows the end from the beginning of an event.

Everything about life: past, present and the future, are all captured in the Holy Bible, and embracing that truth is what engenders exploits. The truth of the Bible is never old, outdated or obsolete. The truth as contained in the Bible is eternally true, forever settled and forever current (Hebrews 6 vs. 12; 2 Corinthians 13 vs. 8).

Every giant in any field of endeavour is a product of the giant before them. It is pride not to identify a mentor in one's field of pursuit. Without a mentor you will be limited. The law of procreation posits that like begets like; in any field of human endeavour, be it online or on ground, everyone needs a mentor to emerge a high-flyer.

Mentorship is one cheap way to make the most of one's life journey. If you must be a giant you must connect to another giant and follow the step taken by that mentor to command the same result. Following the steps of giants is what gives birth to another giant (1 Corinthians 11 vs. 1; Philippians 3 vs. 17). Every dedicated follower of a giant eventually emerges a giant as well (John 8 vs. 39). No giant ever make himself. Giants are made by those who have gone ahead of them.

WHAT WERE THE STEPS OF ABRAHAM?

- 1. Abraham was a spiritual man (Revelation 1 vs. 10).
- 2. He was a lover of God (James 2 vs. 23).
- 3. He was ready to obey any instruction of God irrespective of the cost (John 14 vs. 21).
- 4. He was a liberal soul; people only lack what they keep, they don't lack what they give.
- 5. He was an ardent tither.
- 6. He was a lover, irrespective of circumstances.
