Whatever you don't have understanding of, you cannot be outstanding in it, (Ecclesiastes 10:15). It is very critical to understand the fundamentals of success, (Joshua 1:8). Every constitution and law in most human dealings stems from the Bible. The Bible is God's manual for outstanding success.

We serve a super successful God and so, He is qualified to give us a manual on success. He created the world in six days and, till date, the world is still being unraveled and new discoveries are being made continually.

The Bible unveils God's plans and purpose as it relates to every believer, (Deuteronomy 28:1). Following the instruction of scriptures is the pathway to outstanding success. It is the doing of what is received that brings about outstanding success, (Joshua 1:8). It is the action taken on the word that brings about success.

Breakthrough in life is not a promise, it's a covenant. It is the prerogative of the one who has promised you to make it happen, but covenant is different, it's an agreement and each party has a responsibility. Outstanding success is the responsibility of you and God and until your own part is fulfilled, you cannot question God about His, (Luke 5:2-5).

Outstanding success is dependent on simple obedience to the instructions of the Master. Until our own part is played, God is not committed to play His own part, (Ecclesiastes 10:18).

Commitment is key to accomplishment, (Proverbs 24:27). It's always important not to place the cart before the horse; the greater your commitment to a given task, the greater your accomplishment.
