Theme: Putting the Word to Work (Part 1)

Principles may fail; counsel may not deliver, but God's word will always work and command proofs. The word of God is God's miracle bank from where believers must constantly draw their desires from (Matthew 8 vs. 8, 13; Isaiah 55 vs. 11).

The best medical science can offer any man in need of health and wholeness will always take time to deliver the desired effect. However, God's word will always act at the instant, when it comes in contact with the faith of such individual (Psalm 107 vs. 20) and His word carries virtue that can effect instant performance (Luke 5 vs. 5 vs. 1 - 6).

Every outstanding feat comes via the application of the word (John 9 vs. 6 - 7), because all manner of miracles are packaged in the word. Until you put the word to work, you cannot enjoy the blessing it carries.

The word of God is not a subject of agreement, but that of taking bold steps in line with discovery (Psalm 119 vs. 97 - 100). The power of the word is in the performance of the word.

One cardinal way of outing the word to work is through prayer. A lifestyle of prayer grants unfettered access to the wonders locked up in the word (Jeremiah 33 vs. 3; Isaiah 45 vs. 11).

Prayers, based on the word, guarantees breakthroughs in life (Matthew 7 vs. 7 - 8). Prayer grants access to divine intervention via the word that one must have located (Philippians 2 vs. 10; Psalm 138 vs. 2; Acts 4 vs. 29 – 31; Psalm 114 vs. 7; Acts 16 vs. 25).

Believers are defeated in the battles of life because they have not search for and located the right word of God, with which to tackle and confront issues facing them.
