Theme: Putting the Word to Work (Part 2)

Whenever your word comes your liberty is established. However, it is what one does with the encountered word that counts. God's word is a miracle bank: everything that anyone can ever desire in life is packaged and embedded in the word (Matthew 8 vs. 8 - 13).

God's word carries the capacity to create instant effect. Man is a creation of the word, and it can only take the word to repair any failing part of man. Experts in any field of human endeavour do refer cases to others, but God's word can never refer any case to another. The word of God will refer no case to another because it carries the capacity to fix man.

Locating the right word is key to making things work in the life of a believer, because every outstanding feat is at the instance of an encounter with the word of God (John 9 vs. 7).

Until a believer puts the word to work, he/she cannot enjoy the blessings inherent therein (Psalm 119 vs. 97 - 100). The believer prevails by grace, and grace is a function of word encounter. Standing on the word is vital in maintaining our standing in life.

HOW TO PUT THE WORD TO WORK?

Fundamentally to making the word work for man is that he must subject himself to a studious life: reading and studying the word avails the believer's mind to tap into that of God, which in turn engenders excellence (1 Timothy 4 vs. 13; 2 Timothy 2 vs. 15). The believer's approval only come as a result of what is stored on the inside.

Studying God's word gives the believer guarantee that prophecies will be fulfilled in his life (Isaiah 34 vs. 16). The word is the antenna of the spiritual realm that connects us to what God has in store for us (Daniel 9 vs. 2).
