Essence of Foundation in Capacity Building

Students, it is necessary to understand your foundation in Christ, so that you can build capacity.

Why Foundation? The foundation of a building determines how high the building can go without collapsing and you may not understand how far you can go when you do not understand your foundation.

If the foundation is wrong, the building cannot be right. Foundation determines the type of function the building will perform.

One cannot build beyond what one's foundation can accommodate. The foundation in this instance is your bloodlines, which can either limit or enhance capacity.

There is no limitation to the capacity you can build but you need to attend to this issue, less you a become victim for life. Your bloodlines can either limit or enhance your capacity.

Whatever you want in life is attainable when you address your bloodlines.

Genesis 49:5-7, "Simeon and Levi are brothers; Their swords are implements of violence. "Let my soul not enter into their council; Let not my glory be united with their assembly; Because in their anger they slew men, And in their self-will they lamed oxen. Cursed be their anger, for it is fierce; And their wrath, for it is cruel. I will disperse them in Jacob, And scatter them in Israel."

Numbers 20:11-12, "Then Moses lifted up his hand and struck the rock twice with his rod; and water came forth abundantly, and the congregation and their beasts drank. But the LORD said to Moses and Aaron, "Because you have not believed Me, to treat Me as holy in the sight of the sons of Israel, therefore you shall not bring this assembly into the land which I have given them."

The man Moses saw the glory of God, struck the rock and water gushed out, he stretched the rod and the sea parted but the anger in his bloodline became his albatross.

When we talk about capacity, we think only about the mind, but it also means building the spirit man.
