### COVENANT UNIVERSITY APPOINTS DR. JONATHAN AREMU PROFESSOR OF INTERNATIONAL ECONOMIC RELATIONS

e all have dreams. But in order to make dreams come into reality, it takes an awful lot of determination, dedication, self-discipline, and effort."

The above empowering quote by Jesse Owens, the American track-and-field legend, captures the elevation of Dr Jonathan Aremu to the professorial cadre of Covenant University, as Professor of International Economic Relations.

His appointment was announced by the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Charles Ayo, today, April 23, after a brief meeting with some members of the University Management. The Vice-Chancellor said his appointment was ratified by the Board of Regents after professorial assessments from the External Assessors had been duly undertaken, which validated the earlier prima facie cases established by the University's Appointment and Promotion Committee.

Professor Ayo expressed optimism that Professor Aremu's appointment would culminate in a robust industry relationship and collaboration for the University, considering his great and diverse industry experience, especially as consultant to many regional bodies in

the continent and beyond. He noted that it came at a time when the University is planning to host captains of industries to a University/Industry Partnership Luncheon with the aim of harmonizing industry/academic partnership for national development.

Professor Aremu, who had a short stint as the University's acting Vice-Chancellor in 2005, was charged to see his new appointment as a call to a higher academic leadership role where more outstanding and ground-breaking contributions would be expected for both academic and community service goals of the University.

# PET. ENGINE STUDENT EMERGES FIRST AT SPE AFRICA FORUM IN KAMPALA, UGANDATO REPRESENT AFRICA IN HOUSTON, TEXAS

Engineering student of Covenant University, Zainab Titus has distinguished herself at the 2015 SPE Africa Region Students Technical Paper contest, which took place on the April 18, 2015 at Makerere University, Kampala, Uganda. Zainab was selected through a rigorous process in which the SPE considered over 170 submitted abstracts from African students in various universities across the

Continent.

From this large pool of abstracts, twelve (eight in the undergraduate category and four in the postgraduate category) were successful and invited, all-expense paid to present their work at Makerere University, in Kampala, Uganda.

Participants at the contest presented their abstracts, which covered a brief introduction, literature review, methodology, results, analysis/interpretations and conclusions and recommendations. Zainab presented an abstract on "Analytical Model for Improving Completion Efficiency and Production Optimization", which is a newly developed diagnostic tool with wide industry applications. This earned her remarkable approval from the panel of judges and other participants, thereby emerging "The First Place Winner for the Undergraduate Category in all of Africa". The first place winners in both categories would represent Africa at the Annual Technical Conference and Exhibition (ATCE) in Houston, Texas in September, 2015.

This was the first appearance of Covenant University in the contest.
