fter revealing the University's goal for 2015/2016 Academic Session-"Innovation, Product Development and Nation Building",

The Vice-Chancellor, Covenant University, Professor Charles Ayo has further stressed that the 2015/2016 Academic Session would witness new products through the University's research base that would solve the challenges facing the country and the continent.

Professor Charles Ayo revealed this recently in an interview with Cyber Africa of the African Independent Television (AIT), adding that the institution would also collaborate with the industry to develop commercialized products that would be beneficial to humanity and lead to national development.

According to him, "By the grace of God, in the 2015/2016 Academic Session, homegrown tangible and intangible products shall emerge from the University to solve the myriad of problems that the nation is faced with.

"To us in Covenant University, we believe it is high time we start solving the problems faced in Nigeria and Africa. Come this session, we want products to be produced in collaboration with the industry that will meet the required standards for consumers," he added.

The Vice-Chancellor also stated that inline with the goal for the new academic session, the University has commenced series of innovations that would continue to bring exposure to her students, thereby raising the new
