Covenant University Promotes 40 Faculty to Professorial Cadre



he Management of Covenant University on Tuesday, July 28, 2015, announced the promotion of 40 of its Faculty to the professorial cadre, even as the Chancellor, Dr. David Oyedepo, enjoined them not to be entangled by their titles.

While making the announcement, the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Charles Ayo, explained that the elevation of 12 faculty to Full Professorship level and 28 to Associate Professorship level was the outcome of the promotion exercise carried out by the Appointment and

Promotion Committee (A&PC) for the just concluded 2014/2015 Academic Session and validated by External Assessors.

The Vice-Chancellor also announced the appointment of four newly engaged professors and enjoined everyone to provide new level of academic leadership in the

University.

The Chancellor, Dr. David Oyedepo, while receiving them in a separate meeting in his office, charged them to prove their self-esteem. "Please be charge with self-esteem that you have Christ and you can do all things," he advised.

He said further, "I want you to remain confident in God for maximum impact in your pursuit. You have creative capability and it is time to prove the worth of what you carry. You can create the things you are going around the world to look for. You carry things in you that the world is looking for."

Dr. Oyedepo, who is also the Chairman, Board of Regents of the University, advised the newly promoted faculty not to let the title entangle them but they should be value-driven people.

The Chancellor also counseled them to see their lifting as the doing of the Lord, noting that no matter who they are, it only takes the backing of God to excel in life. He assured them that with their faith and dedication, the Vision 10:2022, 1 of 10 in 10 would be accomplished speedily. He, therefore, congratulated them and prayed for the grace of God for them to excel in their new position.

The newly promoted full professors include Professor Francis Iyoha of the Department of Accounting and the current Deputy Dean of the School of Business; Professor Daniel Gberevbie of Political Science and International Relations, who is also the Deputy Dean, School of Social Science and Professor Phillip Alege, the current HOD of Economics and Development Studies.


In addition, Prof. Charles Ayo said

He was once the Dean of School of Postgraduate Studies and the Deputy Dean, School of Leadership Development, College of Leadership Development Studies.

His areas of research interest include span linguistics and literature, where he is currently teaching stylistics and other areas of language study. He has supervised several undergraduate projects as well as Master's dissertations and Ph.D theses.
