#### Vice-Chancellor Meets Young Professionals, Expresses Confidence in Nigerian Youths

he Vice-Chancellor, Covenant University, Professor Charles Ayo, has expressed confidence in Nigerian youths to take over the mantle of leadership in the nearest future and rescue the nation from its present economic and political doldrums.

Professor Ayo made this known while addressing the leadership of the Nigerian Young Professionals Forum (NYPF), led by its Chairman and Founder, Mr. Moses Siasia, who paid him a courtesy call in his office on Tuesday, April 5, 2016.

The Vice-Chancellor had initially showed concern for Nigerian youths as a result of lack of access to tertiary education, unemployment, insecurity and other social vices affecting the political and economic state of the country but noted that groups like NYPF has erased the bleak future of Nigerian youths from his mind.

"If they have not been here," he said, "I wouldn't have known that we have these crème of young talented individuals that are working silently to transform this nation. With their presence here today, I am seeing a brighter future and a great Nigeria."

The highly elated Vice-Chancellor also stated that the University was ready to partner with the NYPF to train and produce young entrepreneurs and leaders who would transform the nation. "Until what we teach in the classroom is able to transform the

abundant natural and human resources that we have in the country, with little or no importation from anywhere, we are yet to

The Chairman and Founder of NYPF. Mr. Moses Siasia, had earlier briefed the Vice-Chancellor and other members of the University's management team about the objectives of the Forum, noting that the country had not been able to tap up to 5% of the youthful resource in the nation.

The Sub-Dean, College of Business and Social Sciences of the University, Dr. Oluwole Iyiola, gave the advice in a keynote address at the Entrepreneurial Development Studies (EDS) Day recently.

Dr. Iyiola, who stood in for the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Charles Ayo, noted that EDS is a vital part of the development in the world. He stated that some multinational organisations started as little idea from the classroom. "Do not despise your little idea, you may be sitting on a keg of gold," he added.

EDS, according to him, would make them employers of labour if they pay attention to what they are taught.

Also speaking at the event, a Guest speaker, Mr. Olawale Lawal, advised the audience, made up of students, to start business early, noting that the earlier they start, the earlier they figure out some of the challenges and failures.

Lawal, who is a graduate of ICT Class 2010 of Covenant University, is also a Managing Partner and co-founder of Dabs.com.ng (an online fashion store). He stated that, "I will also advise anyone to embrace their failure because it is their failure that will make them at the end of the day."

### Explore Career Opportunities in Oil Industry, Expert Charges Budding Petroleum Engineers

A noil industry expert, Dr. David Agiddi, has urged students of Petroleum Engineering at Covenant University, Ota, Ogun State, to equip themselves with the right mix of education in order to take advantage of the numerous opportunities in the oil and gas industry.

Agiddi, a Senior Asset Manager at Seven Sea Energy Nigeria Limited, who was Guest Speaker at the Town and Gown seminar of the Department of Petroleum Engineering held on Tuesday, said with the uninterrupted progression in global energy consumption, expansion in oil production and exploration and wide scope of jobs available in the industry, prospective graduates of Petroleum Engineering should be able to fashion out careers for themselves.

He enumerated the four major industry players who offer job opportunities. First, he said, is the National Company, which has the Upstream and the Downstream sectors, ventures, vessels among others where graduates can get engaged in different roles. Next, according to him, is the International Oil Companies, which are usually segmented and have refining companies.

There are also Independent Oil Companies like Conoil and Seplat, which are focused on the upstream business, including Service Companies that provide service to all the other companies, Dr. Agiddi added.

"Again, we have the Research Institutes and the Universities that will keep supplying the manpower to these major players," he explained. "With the right mix of education, you can plug yourself in one of those companies.

"Geologists, Production Engineers and other support disciplines like Data Management and Surveillance are jobs that exist in the industry.

"Open your minds to new challenges in the industry and you'll have a fulfilled career. There is a lot of money involved. It gives you opportunity to meet like minds since challenges in the oil industry are not peculiar to Nigeria."

Chemical Engineering Students Encouraged to Focus on Innovation Based Technology

he students of Chemical Engineering Department of Covenant University have been told that transformation into high value-added products for economic growth is a key investment driver for Nigeria, which is a country endowed with a unique blend of diverse and abundant natural resources such as petroleum, gas, minerals (bauxite, coal, limestone, etc) and agriculture.

This was stated by the Guest Speaker, Professor Adesoji Adesina, at a recent Town and Gown seminar of the department where he gave a lecture with the topic, 'University-Industry Relationship as a Driver of Innovation-Based Entrepreneurship for Sustainable Economic Development.'

Professor Adesina, who was a former Professor, School of Chemical

Engineering, University of New South Wales, Sydney, NSW, Australia and currently the CEO, Atodatech LLC, a private Engineering Company in Pasadena, California, USA, stated that longitudinal economic growth data revealed strong positive correlation with labour and capital and negatively correlated with research and development as well as innovation. However, he said, single resource-dependency is unsustainable.

He postulated that modern era is a knowledge-based economy migrating into sustainable development, controlled by technology, innovation, management and entrepreneurship. Professor Adesina emphasised sustainability as being the nexus of innovation.
