he Vice-Chancellor of Covenant University, Professor Charles Ayo, has charged all the Departments in the University to limber up in their research and project development activities in emulation of the milestones achieved by the Department of Biological Sciences.

ovenant University on Monday, June 13, 2016 commissioned a Geographic Information System (GIS) Laboratory. The commissioning, performed by the Dean, College of Engineering, Professor Samuel John, who stood in for the Vice-Chancellor, Professor Charles Ayo, also signaled the commencement of a 5-day Workshop on GIS and Remote Sensing Applications.

While declaring the Workshop open, the representative of the Vice-

Chancellor noted that GIS would enable the University and the nation at large know the facilities to put in place in order to monitor security, agriculture and other activities in the country. He expressed confidence that the participants would enjoy and benefit maximally from the training.

The Workshop Coordinator, Mr. Gideon Adeyemi, stated that GIS is unique because of its capacity to perform integrated analysis of data sets that are of different origins, scales and time to aid decision making in natural resources management, transportation planning, assets and facilities management, environmental management, food security, business intelligence analysis, land information system, health management, tourism among others.

I hope to see your university listed among those we collaborate with where our students can visit your university and your students also visit ours. We can put a MoU together in these areas."

Mr. Jamie Hastings had earlier briefed the Vice-Chancellor and his team that Robert Gordon University has between 350 to 400 Nigerians among its

Following the dedication of the laboratory and the vehicle, Professor Ayo, who expressed satisfaction with what he saw, beseeched God to enable Dr. Eni and her team to be able to achieve success in their undertakings.

"I've never seen a lab like this in the University except when we visited a lab in the United States. Anybody would be proud to bring any researcher anywhere in the world to this place. Now you have shown us round, result is the only thing we are waiting for; result that will announce you and the University to the entire world. And by the grace of God the wisdom required will be bestowed on you and your team in Jesus name Amen," he said.

Explaining the importance of the laboratory equipment and vehicle funded by the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation and the Department for International Development (DFID) UK, Dr. Eni said it is to ensure that virus diseases of root and tuber crops are addressed appropriately and ensure food security for the West African region. "In the laboratory, we have equipment for DNA analysis, DNA isolation and DNA analysis for PCR. We have equipment that will allow us to clone genes and send it out for sequencing and then we have facilities to allow us to engineer genes into other crops. So, we are fully a bio-technology lab. And we've just purchased a project vehicle, because in the farms the roads are rough," she revealed
