Nigerian Army Seeks CU's Support for Establishment of Army University

he Nigerian Army has solicited the assistance of Covenant University for the establishment of a proposed Nigerian Army University of Science and Technology.

The leader of a delegation from the Nigerian Army Institute of Technology and Environment Studies, Maj. Gen Mathias Efeovbokhan (rtd), made the disclosure on Friday, January 20, 2017, during a courtesy visit to the Management of Covenant University at the University's campus in Ota, Ogun State.

Maj. Gen Efeovbokhan, who is Chairman of the committee set up by the Chief of Army Staff (COAS), Lt. Gen Tukur Yusuf Buratai, to midwife the Army University, said that the decision to establish the Nigerian Army University of Science and Technology was informed by the needs assessment that was carried out by the COAS. Lt. Gen Buratai, he said, found out that there were problems in the Nigerian Military but no place where you can get solutions.

"I want a university that would be a solution centre; a university that can provide credible and mathematical solutions not only for problems of the Nigerian Army, but also the problems of the Military and by extension

that of the nation," the COAS was quoted as saying.

The COAS, according to Maj. Gen Efeovbokhan, holds Covenant University in very high regards due to its trailblazing antecedents and spiritual foundation, qualities that informed the decision to seek a collaborative engagement



between Covenant University and the proposed Army University, which would be sited in Biu, Borno State, and scheduled to take off later in the year.

The Deputy Vice-Chancellor, Covenant University, Professor Shalom Chinedu, expressed delight that the Nigerian Army had found the University worthy of being a mentor and partner

Expert Reveals Relevance of Geophysics in Food Production, Others

f Nigeria has to maintain her sovereignty as a nation, she must, among other things, lay emphasis on food security, an area which experts say geophysics has significant role to play through the determination of soil fertility suitable for any particular crop leading to high yield, food exportation and foreign exchange earnings.

The Guest Speaker, Professor Elijah Ayolabi, made the submission while presenting a paper titled, "Relevance of Geophysics in Present Economic Dispensation," on Tuesday, January 17, 2017, at a Special Seminar Presentation organised by the Department of Physics, Covenant University, Ota.

Professor Ayolabi, who is also the Vice-Chancellor of Mountain Top University, highlighted the relevance of geophysics to the environment, road construction, transport, agriculture, search for hydrocarbon and solid minerals, water resources, housing, power generation, terrorism and security as well as anticorruption fight among others.

"The economic impacts of geophysics

technologies as well as latest success rates have not been adequately utilized for our economic development. In order to improve the economic relevance of geophysics, we must start engaging the capabilities of geophysics in our national development as well as economic evolution," he explained.

The guest speaker noted that in the quest by the government to diversify the economy from oil base, geophysics would be relevant in locating the site for solid minerals in the sub-surface for exploration. "There is no state in this country that does not have a particular solid mineral. If well managed, each state would be able to stand on its own economically," he added.

On the relevance of geophysics to Housing, Professor Ayolabi argued that the spate of building collapse in the country could have been reduced if the sub-surface was taken into consideration. He noted that emphases were often laid on substandard building materials when structures collapse, but with geophysics, cavity on the sub-surface could be



detected before structures are erected on the

Professor Ayolabi emphasised that if geophysics technologies were well utilized, it would provide job opportunities and avenue for training upcoming geophysicists in the country.

The Head, Department of Physics, Dr. Mojisola Usikalu, had earlier in her welcome remarks enjoined the participants to be in good disposition to gain maximally from Professor Ayolabi's wealth of experience.

Professor Elijah Ayolabi also paid a courtesy call on the Vice-Chancellor, Covenant University, Professor AAA. Atayero, in his office where they had discussions before the seminar.
