The Guest Speaker explained that one of the most useful techniques that would enable a Biochemist to improve life and processes of Fast Moving Consumer Goods was the understanding of Quality Management System (QMS).


A Quality Management System, according to him, was a formalized system that documented processes, procedules appl

Bank's Centre of Excellence is one of the major initiatives under the "AfDB Jobs for Youth in Africa Strategy". The goal of the strategy is to help create 25 million jobs for youths in Africa over the next 10 years. AfDB also plan to equip 50 million youths with a blend of soft and hard skills to improve their rate of e m p l o y a b i l i t y a n d entrepreneurial success. The

project aims to nurture Africa's next generation of a workforce to be digitally enabled. Partnering with AfDB on the project are Facebook and Microsoft, among others.

According to the project summary of the Coding for Employment programme, its three aims include: equipping 130 centres of excellence with ICT infrastructure; training youths in demand-driven ICT skills and entrepreneurship; and linking graduates to the ICT ecosystem for access to internships and job opportunities. The 130 centres of excellence are spread across the 5 selected countries and it is expected that each centre will train at least 1,800 youths. Hence, Covenant is excited to be one of the 130 centres of excellence in Africa, within five countries and among the only four in Nigeria.

Adetunji also noted that QMS served many purposes which included improved processes, reduction of waste, lowering of costs, facilitating and identifying

training opportunities, engagement of staff, as well as setting organisation-wide direction.


He enjoined the participants, particularly the students, to prepare for the world of work as future Biochemists, noting that, "The best preparation for tomorrow is doing your best today."

"We must remember that the human body is biochemical in nature, thus must be fed with foods that are compatible with its natural mechanism and not otherwise. As Chemists, providing healthier options may seem daunting, even challenging; however, if we begin to work in that direction, we will help move positively towards a healthy generation now and in the future," she advised.

The Head of the Department, Professor Olayinka Ajani, had earlier in his welcome remarks noted that the essence of the Town and Gown was for the students to understand how to translate theories to tangible products. in Ensuring a Healthy Generation." She noted that diseases affecting young and older generations today were mostly from the water and food consumed as well as the individual's general lifestyle.

"You are what you eat. Whenever you eat or drink, you either eat to feed a disease or fight a disease. How you prepare your food can affect how you look, feel and how long you live," she said.

Okoli charged chemists to start providing healthy alternatives since this generation, according to the World Health Organisation (WHO), has been termed 'the most
